Married woman | Lived in Kiberg outside Vardø | Denounced by Synøve Olsdatter and Berigette Edisdatter | Summoned to the court in a series of linked witchcraft trials during which 13 women were sentenced to the stake

## Lisebet Poulsdatter

Brought before the court in Kiberg on 17 February 1653
Denied knowing any witchcraft
Was brought before the court at Vardøhus Castle on 28 February 1653
ACCUSED
of practising witchcraft

**CONFESSED** 

that she learnt witchcraft from Marette, Torsten's wife that she received her powers in a piece of bread and butter that the Evil One, who called himself Jermund, appeared shortly after that she first tested her powers on one of her sheep, which she cursed, whereupon it died

that she helped cast the spell on Anders Hess's ship from Bergen that she was, then, in the likeness of a swan and in the company of others from around Vadsø

that she took part in setting fire to Hans Christensen's house in Kiberg that she, Guri and Anne started the fire by throwing hemp on a lit lamp that she, Guri and Anne cast a spell on Peder Michelsen, who died hunting seals in the East

that, on that occasion, she, Guri and Anne wore the shapes of a swan, a goose and a falcon

Brought before the court again, in Kiberg on 20 March 1653; confirmed her confession

Convicted of practice of witchcraft Sentenced to death in fire at the stake
